Development Update

Six tenders were sent out before Christmas, five came back, and the three lowest were analysed in more detail. All tenders came in way over budget and an extra church council was held on Wednesday 18th January to discuss the figures.

It was agreed at this meeting that we delay phase 3 of the project for now, that we appoint Butlers as contractors, and that we accept the savings recommended by the development committee. The committee will now go back to the architects, then the contractors with these suggestions.

We are hoping that building may start at the end of February, in which case worship will move to the church hall a couple of weeks before this to allow the church to be cleared.

More fund-raising is planned; there is to be another beetle drive on 17th March at 7pm and we hope for another quiz a bit later in the year. We will also be using Blessings Bags, which Rosemary has written about later on in this newsletter.

Charitable Giving

At the last stewards meeting we started to discuss the church's charitable giving. People may not be aware that throughout the year we contribute to a range of charities.

At the February Church Council we decide our regular annual donations. Last year we sent £100 each to Methodist Homes, LWPT (local preachers trust), Jimmy's night shelter, Street Pastors and Camtrust. We also give annually to the Methodist Fund for property (£150 at present) and £120 to the Histon and Impington Council of Churches.

Then in Lent we give some money from Saturday and Sunday coffee. The charity usually changes each year and is decided at the February CC. Anyone can suggest a suitable charity.

The Sunday coffee money after communion services goes into the benevolent fund which provides presents for elderly and/or sick church people at Christmas and can also be used by the minister in cases of need.

Money from our Harvest Songs of Praise and the harvest market usually go to All We Can (a Methodist relief and development charity) and money from the Christmas carols by candlelight and Christmas Day service to Action for Children. Methodist Homes is supported by envelopes in the pew for a designated Sunday, as is Methodist Women in Britain (MWiB) by the Easter offering envelopes.

Also in the autumn there is usually the Shoebox appeal, the British legion poppy appeal and the Angel Tree appeal (for presents for the children of prisoners).

Then there is the ongoing appeal for the food banks. There is a basket in the church foyer for donations and a list of suitable items.

Finally we try to respond through a retiring collection to urgent disasters. The most recent one was the appeal for Haiti after the hurricane.

Overall in 2016 we gave over £3000. If you have any thoughts on what we can do more, or differently, please talk to one of the stewards.
